

Pastor's Pen — "A Good Time"

This is a good time to be a pastor. I might not have said that with the same degree of authenticity five weeks ago. But then Linda and I were able to get away in January. We

needed it. While we were away, it looked like our Pastor Search Team had zeroed in on my successor. That was exciting, and it gave me fresh passion to finish well and pass the baton.

As it turned out, that candidate is not the Lord's choice for us. This was disappointing at first, but not disheartening. This is still a good time to be a pastor.

It's a good time to reimagine my role. I learned much from conversations with various candidates over the last few months. I received what I have frequently craved – an outsider's perspective on what we do well and what we can do better. This is a good time.

It's a good time to celebrate God's gifts. It's been humbling for Linda and me to have time together and with the Lord – time to think and time to thank. I don't know many pastors who have enjoyed the kind of stability, growth, and mission we have witnessed for three decades. Most recently, we're celebrating the generous

and faithful response of our church family to the "Thompson Mission Fund." Your gifts will immediately strengthen two mission partners – Valley Haven Camp in Mountain View and Doxa Deo Church in Chisinau, Moldova. They will also ensure and extend a legacy of perpetual mission dollars through the Bob and Linda Thompson Mission Fund. This is a good time.

It's a good time to anticipate what lies ahead. You might read all this and wonder if we would reconsider the retirement timeline. Short answer: No. The factors behind our timeline remain. On a personal level, even though I have no known issues that will shorten my life, the frequency of age-related physical issues is growing. I don't want to limp across the finish line. Also, the pull of our out-of-town children and grandchildren is strong. More importantly, I still believe Corinth needs a fresh restart under a new leader. This is a good time.

It's a good time to trust the Lord with the process, the choice, and the timing. This is a good time – not just for the two of us, for all of us.
